FORT LAUDERDALE, FL — (May 1, 2017) The Broward League of Cities recently awarded \$1,000 scholarships to four distinguished Broward County high school seniors who plan to pursue a major in public administration, political science or another government-related field.

In its 7th year, the Broward League of Cities' Scholarship for Government Studies program has donated a total of \$28,000 to students who are preparing for a career in government and have demonstrated strong leadership skills, academic achievement and a commitment to community service. The four recipients were selected from 44 applicants and include:

Sierra Molina - Fort Lauderdale resident attending Pompano Beach High School

Sierra plans to study International Relations, specifically diplomacy and international affairs. She is a member of the National Honor Society and president of HOSA. She has participated in Girls State and Youth Leadership Broward, volunteered at ARC Broward, Kids in Distress and is a member of the Fort Lauderdale Garden Club.

Zak Myers - Hollywood resident attending South Broward High School

Zak wants to study Public Relations and Political Science with the hope of a career with the State Department or with Homeland Security. He is senior class president, yearbook managing editor, National Honor Society historian and Florida Future Educators secretary. Zak has been awarded Eagle Scout by the Boy Scouts of America for his service project in Haiti.

Rina Laklahlani - Davie resident attending Nova High School

Rina intends to study Ethics, Politics, Economics and Political Science and has a career goal of going to law school and becoming a member of congress. She is ranked #1 in her class of 439 students, president of the National Honor Society and vice president of the South Asian Society. She is an ambassador for the Elephant Sanctuary, a 2,700-acre refuge in Tennessee and has interned with Congressman Ted Deutch on his Congressional Youth Cabinet.

Joany Vazquez - North Lauderdale resident attending the College Academy at Broward College With a 5.2 GPA, Joany plans on studying Accounting and Economics, starting her career at one of the Big Four accounting firms and eventually working for the IRS as an agent or the CIA as a financial analyst. She started "Operation Giveback," a club that creates awareness about local veterans, and she tutors students, grades assignments and translates for English language learners at Cypress Elementary, where she attended elementary school.
