


A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

Hands Only CPR

BE THE DIFFERENCE FOR SOMEONE YOU LOVE

If you are called on to perform CPR in an emergency, you will most likely be trying to save the life of someone you love: a child, a spouse, a parent or a friend.


- Seventy percent of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen in homes.
- About 46 percent of people who experience an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest receive the immediate help that they need before professional help arrives.
- Hands-Only CPR has been shown to be as effective as conventional CPR for cardiac arrest at home, at work or in public spaces.



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Hands Only CPR

2 STEPS TO SAVE A LIFE



Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. It is recommended for use by people who see a teen or adult suddenly collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting (such as at home, at work or in a park). It consists of two easy steps:

- 1. Call 9-1-1 (or send someone to do that).
- 2. Push hard and fast in the center of the chest.

(operator) tells you to hang up. The dispatcher will ask you about the emergency. fixed location or address. Remember that answering the dispatcher's questions especially if you're calling from a mobile phone as that is not associated with a They will also ask for details like your location. It is important to be specific, When you call 911, you need to stay on the phone until the 911 dispatcher will not delay the arrival of help.

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

Giving CPR and using an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) can greatly increase the victim's chance of survival.

What is an AED?

- The automated external defibrillator (AED) is a computerized medical device.
- An AED can check a person's heart rhythm and recognize a rhythm that requires a shock.
- It can advise the rescuer when a shock is needed.
- The AED uses voice prompts, lights and text messages to tell the rescuer the steps to take.







The AED will analyze the person's heart rate, and determine whether a shock is necessary. If a shock is required make sure that you and all bystanders are dear of the victim.

STEP 5:



begins to reanafyze. If necessary, repeat immediately resume CPR for 2 minutes, until the AED instructs you to stop and Press the "shock" button on the AED machine, After shock is administered steps 4-5

Wounds That Can Lead to Death from Bleeding



Arm and Leg Wounds

>Most frequent cause of preventable death from injury

▶ Bleeding from these wounds can be controlled by

✓ DIRECT PRESSURE or a TOURNIQUET

Torso Junctional Wounds


VNeck, shoulder, and groin

✓ DIRECT PRESSURE or WOUND PACKING



Wounds That Can Lead to Death from Bleeding



Chest and Abdominal Injuries

- **V**Front, back, or side
- **V**Usually cause internal bleeding
- \checkmark This bleeding CANNOT be stopped outside the hospital
- \checkmark These victims need rapid transport to a trauma center
- ✓ Identify these patients to EMS providers when they arrive

First and foremost...Ensure your own safety!

The ABCs of Bleeding

A – Alert – call 9-1-1

B – **B**leeding – find the bleeding injury

C - Compress – apply pressure to stop the bleeding by:

Covering the wound with a clean cloth and applying pressure by pushing directly on it with both H

Packing (filling) the wound with gauze or a clean cloth and then applying pressure with both hands က


