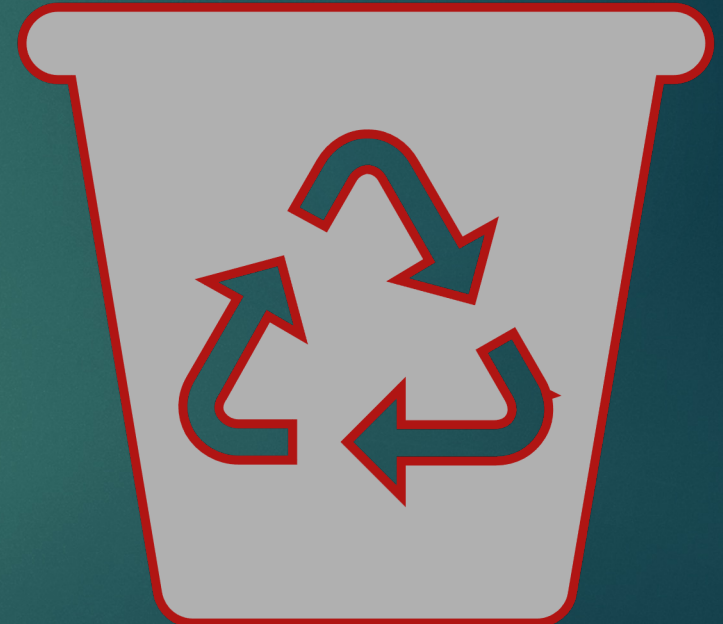

# Waste Generation Study



A waste generation study determines the amount of waste generated that can create a basis for assessments.



County funded 50 % of the study cost and the municipalities funded the other half based upon population.



SCS Engineers was retained to conduct the Waste Generation Study which is currently on going.

# Mission Statement

*To protect the long-term public health, safety and welfare, the Parties commit to working together collaboratively through the creation of the Authority. The Authority will develop and implement a long-term, environmentally sustainable, transparent, innovative, and economically efficient plan and approach to disposal, reduction, recycling, and reuse of Solid Waste generated in Broward County.*

# Structure of ILA-created Authority

## ▶ Governing Board

- ▶ 1 representative per government party

## ▶ Executive Committee

- ▶ 11 members selected from the Governing Board
- ▶ 1 County member and 10 members in categories representing Large, Medium, and Small Municipalities

## ▶ Technical Advisory Committee

## ▶ Executive Director

- ▶ Appointed by Governing Board

# Activities of ILA-created Authority

## ▶ Master Plan of Operations

- ▶ The comprehensive planning framework and strategic direction to manage waste and recyclables, across Broward, consistent with the parties' responsibilities under applicable law

## ▶ Special Assessments

- ▶ To fund the services provided by the Authority

## ▶ Flow Control

- ▶ To direct waste and recyclables to appropriate facilities

# Membership Obligations

- ▶ Adoption of Master Plan of Operations
  - ▶ Requires 80% supermajority of Governing Board (by population) plus County
  - ▶ Parties that do not adopt first Master Plan may withdraw
- ▶ Funding Obligations before Special Assessment
  - ▶ Prior to Special Assessments, each party will contribute funds based on population
- ▶ Commitment of Waste Stream
  - ▶ Parties adopt flow control ordinances to provide their waste to Authority
